The Arc has your back! We will be conducting a class on how to prepare easy appetizers to serve during the Super Bowl. See the calendar on page 3 for more information and to register.


Let Your True Colors Show

Thursday, January 4, at 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm: Basic Craft Class

Intent: To teach basic concepts of gluing, places object in correct position, finger manipulation and scissor use.

<u>Description</u>: This class is designed for individuals who want to try their creative side but need to learn at a slower pace. It is for people who are nervous to try more challenging artisan classes. The classes are small so the instructors can give more individual attention to each participant with goal of having participants grow in skills and be able to advance to more challenging classes.
