Carl was on the board



Monday's in April, Every Monday, at 1:30 pm to 3:00 pm: Garden Club (CLASS FULL)

<u>Intent:</u> To learn how to grow plants and vegetables at home. Allow nature to release your tension and stress. <u>Description:</u> This group will meet weekly throughout the spring and summer doing very hands on weeding, planting, and growing. Power tools used. This is a very interactive class and participants are expected to assist during lessons. <u>Level:</u> Intermediate/Skill Building Educational <u>Registration Required:</u> closed

Tuesday, April 2 and April 16, at 5:30 pm to 6:30 pm: West African Drums

Intent: To enjoy the lively beat of the drum.

<u>Description:</u> This class forms a circle and learns different 'rhythms'. It is a great stress release and data supports that it alters the neurons in the brain. <u>Level:</u> Beginner open/social teaching <u>Registration Required:</u> No, just show up.

Tuesday, April 2 and April 16, at 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm: Arc Angels Chorus (practicing for community event)

Intent: To express one's self through music and singing

<u>Description:</u> This class is for anyone who enjoys music and likes to sing. Always an upbeat time! Level: Beginner open/social teaching Registration Required: No, just show up.

Thursday, April 4, at 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm: Basic Craft Class (last one until next year)

<u>Intent:</u> To teach basic concepts of gluing, places object in correct position, finger manipulation and scissor use. If you participate in this class you CANNOT participate in the woodworking/artisan class.

<u>Description</u>: This class is designed for individuals who want to try their creative side but need to learn at a slower pace. It is for people who are nervous to try more challenging artisan classes. The classes are small so the instructors can give more individual attention to each participant with goal of having participants grow in skills and be able to advance to more challenging classes.

Level: Beginner Type: Independent/Skill Building Teaching.

Monday, April 8, at 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm: Coloring Class (last one until next year)

There is no set teaching. Each person will color something different with a choice of marker, crayon or colored pencil. There will be limited talking as it designed to bring calmness and relaxation. <u>Level:</u> Beginner. open/social teaching <u>Registration Required:</u> No

<u>Tuesday, April 9 and April 23, at 5:30 to 6:30 pm:</u> Uke Group (practicing for upcoming concerts)

Intent: To celebrate wonderful music together through ukulele.

<u>Description:</u> A fun, interactive, lively group that learns a lot of chords in a relaxed and welcoming atmosphere. No experience necessary or musical background needed.

<u>Level:</u> beginner open/social teaching <u>Registration Required:</u> No. The Arc provides the instruments.

Thursday, April 11 and April 25, 5:30 pm to 6:30 pm: Pickleball (last one until next winter)

Intent: To gain a little exercise while learning a new sport

<u>Description:</u> This class is for someone who does not believe they have 'athletic' ability or doesn't' want to compete but just get a little exercise. Don't label yourself - you may enjoy this 'sport'. Find out what the craze across the nation is all about. <u>Level:</u> Beginner.open/social teaching <u>Registration Required:</u> No, The Arc provides the paddles.

Wednesday's/Every Wednesday at 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm: Line Dance

Intent: To get exercise in a fun, social atmosphere

<u>Description</u>: Learn dance steps set to music of all genres and decades. Wheelchairs and walkers can join in the fun. Don't like to dance? This class encourages folks to just clap along in seats.

SAFETY TIP - EMERGENCY PLANNING

Instead of teaching children to run towards police officers in 'blue uniforms' or to stop when a police office states a command, show them photos of lots of law enforcement. Not all police officers wear blue uniforms. The Pennsylvania state police, for example, wear a grey uniform. Bicycle police wear shorts and many times a white shirt, and the mounted police ride horses.

Teach children through photos the different 'faces' of law enforcement so they understand and are not frightened if ever approached by a police officer.
